On the morning of Thursday 17th July, over 200 pupils from Queenborough School and Nursery brought along special Rail 200 artwork and took part in a big procession from the Station onto the Green, creating a "200" to mark "Rail 200" and Queenborough Station's 165th Birthday.

Hannah O'Connor, art lead at the school, who was in charge of more than 240 youngsters said: "We love being creative at Queenborough. When I explained this, everyone wanted to get on board. It was so nice to be able to celebrate Queenborough station's birthday and 200 years of passenger rail travel. It was a collaborative project involving the whole school. Thursday was absolutely brilliant."

On Saturday 19th July, we came together again for another day of birthday activities and celebrations. Swale Borough Council organised a Cycle Re-Cycle sale, Queenborough Town Council held a free raffle with a Hornby train set as the prize. Southeastern had a carboard Queenbrough Express train in the booking hall, where we hosted children's art activities, with more fabulous rail-related prizes. Inspiration at Margate







The Railway 200 exhibition train, Inspiration, visited Margate station 20-21 July, a unique exhibition train, part of a national celebration of the 200th anniversary of the modern railway. In addition to the train's exhibition carriages, a special event at Margate station saw Kent CRP join local people from the tourism sector in Thanet including Dreamland, the Turner Contemporary and the Crab Museum, with market stalls also present from several organisations. A local conservator presented archaeological finds discovered when the original South Eastern Railway was built in the 1840s.

Shortly after opening on Sunday, Southeastern's Matt Fraser extended an invite to Kent Community Rail Partnership to come onboard Inspiration and exhibit in the partnership carriage. While informative, the static displays from Visit Thanet and Creative Isle Community Rail Partnership were not engaging. We were both honoured and delighted to accept and with support from volunteers Dominic Noades and Jonathan Fryer, we were



soon set up to rotate our team to have a presence both in the exhibition marquee and on the train.

Across the two days over 1,000 people came to visit Inspiration, both from the Thanet area and further afield, offering us the chance to engage new audiences with our project work and places to visit on Days Out By Rail adventures along our lines. Inspiration continues its tour of the UK. coming to London Victoria in December.

Ashford Depot Open Day

Southeastern's Exclusive Railway 200 Depot Open Day celebrated 200 years of the passenger railway in the UK; Southeastern opened the doors to their train maintenance depot in Ashford for one very special day. The unique event was hosted by the Southeastern engineering team.

The day was warm and sunny bringing over 2,700 paying visitors. Attractions included walkways around the huge maintenance shed to view trains in various states of repair, the very special Railway 200 Javelin train – 395015, Clan Line steam engine, Unit 1001 Hastings Diesel 'Thumper', Balfour Beatty 'Tiny Tamper', Class 73 GBRf locomotive, Class 66 GBRf locomotive and Stepney, the Bluebell engine. There were many stalls, food venders and free fairground rides for the little ones.

It is estimated the team engaged with around 1000 people, giving away Kent CRP bags, pencils and pens with our website on and leaflets promoting walking and cycling routes around our stations.

This was a great opportunity to promote community rail and on hearing of our station adoption projects and activities several people said, "I wish you were at our station."
